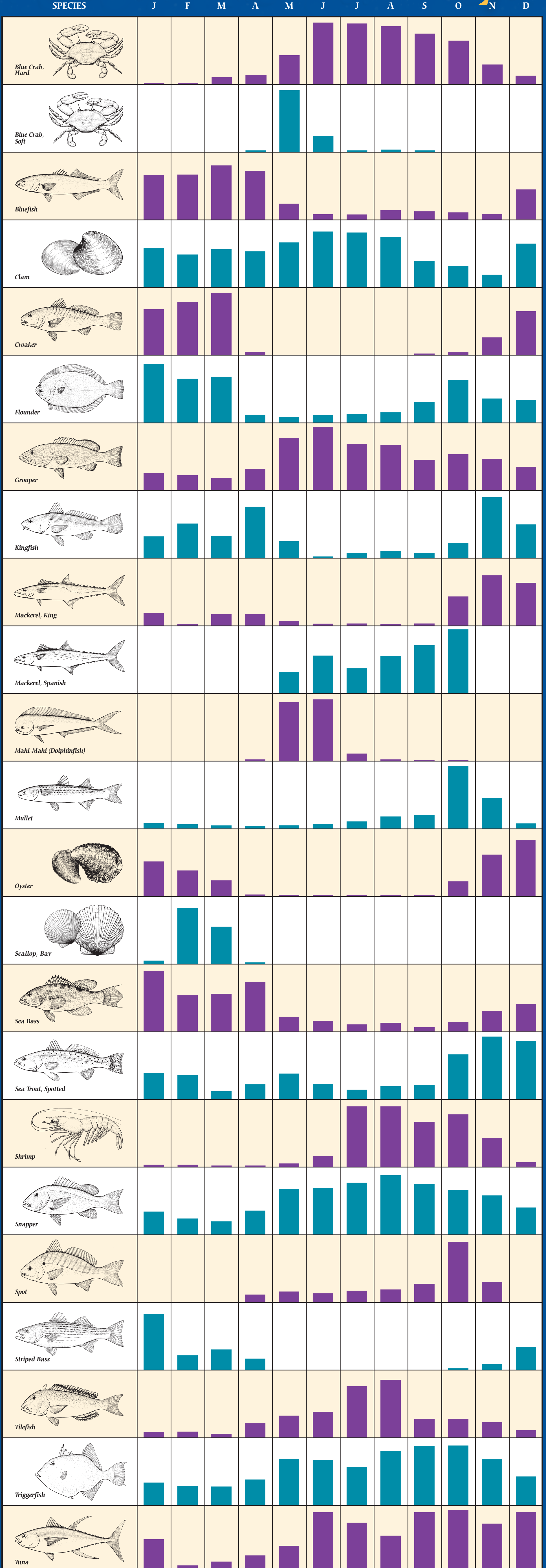


# North Carolina Seafood Availability
